Manuscripts in the form of articles that are the result of theoretical or field research, not previously published in the same or a different language or another

format, can be submitted for consideration. Each submission shall have an average length of 20 to 25 sheets and be formatted in (8.5 x 11 in.) letter size paper, 12-point Arial Font, double spaced (including the references).

Proposals can be presented in English, Portuguese, French, or Spanish languages. Manuscripts shall be original, unpublished contributions, prepared in compliance with Tabula Rasa guidelines: See http://www.revistatabularasa.org/normas/
